Numbers:

4 of the children interviewed by the UN described being abused, a 5th child described being propositioned but refusing. They also described witnessing first-hand 5 other children being abused, and indicated they had heard of 3 others being abused.

The children described 16 different peacekeepers who had abused them personally, or who they had witnessed abuse a child.

Of these 16, the children indicated 11 were French soldiers, 3 were from Chad, and 2 were from Ecuadorial Guinea.
